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IDENTITY THEFT

Being the Victim of Identity Theft can be very frustrating. We hope that this printable document will assist in taking the initial steps for reporting the theft and preventing further loss. In addition to the directions your Bank, attorney, or other advisor may provide, the Police Department recommends that you consider doing the following:

1. File a Police Report with your local Police Department. Be ready to provide the Officer with as much pertinent information as you have relating to the incident(s). Be prepared to provide a written statement.

2. Once the report is taken by the Officer, you will be provided with an incident number. Write down this number so it can be given to Banks, other institutions or agencies that may request this number. Also be sure to record the date and time you make the report, along with the name of the Officer taking the report. Incident # _____

*3. If you have been the Victim of a theft that included your checkbook, credit cards, or other financial documents or information, you will need to contact each of those companies to report the theft as soon as possible. Be sure to document the dates, times and representatives you speak with from each company or institution.

4. For any form of Identity Theft, or possible Identity Theft, you should place a "Fraud Alert" on your credit reports. Obtain a copy of your credit reports and scrutinize them carefully for unauthorized accounts or activity. You can accomplish both of these tasks by contacting the three major credit bureaus. They are:

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5. Report the Identity Theft to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). This will assist law enforcement in their investigations. You may contact them by phone at 1-877-ID-THEFT, or online at www.ftc.gov/idtheft There is a significant amount of information available on this site to assist Victims of Identity Theft and advice on how to help prevent from becoming the Victim of Identity Theft.

A FEW HELPFUL TIPS TO HELP PREVENT IDENTITY THEFT

- Shred financial or other important documents before placing them in the garbage. Identity thieves may rummage through garbage.
- Do not keep unnecessary personal documents in your purse or wallet. Social Security cards should not be kept in your purse or wallet! Shred old credit cards. Do not keep an abundance of credit cards in your purse or wallet.
- Do not leave financial documents, including checks, in your mailbox for pickup. A Thief could potentially take your mail.
- Don't open unknown files or click on e-mails from unknown or suspicious senders on your computer.
- Delete personal information before disposing of a computer. You can also use a "Wipe" utility program to delete information.
- Do not give out your personal information over the phone to someone you don't know.
